Over the initial half of the year, Mahashakti Foundation has accelerated its efforts across communities by carrying out new initiatives and expanding ongoing programs. This period has seen the onboarding of new partners, expanding support for our interventions and extending our reach to thousands of beneficiaries.



During the three-day field visit, Jitender Ghangas, Associate Director, ESG & Sustainability - **LTI Mindtree**, interacted with community members, farmers, women trainees, students, and other local stakeholders across Gudvella, Paikmal, and M Rampur blocks of Odisha. The visit covered key interventions of the Integrated Village Development Program (IVDP),

including water harvesting structures like farm ponds, check dams & Water Absorption Trenches, model nurseries, AWD fields as well as school infrastructure like DigiPathshala. He underlined the need to plan these structures for long-term sustainability and emphasized microplanning for each activity to ensure durability and measurable community impact.

SOLAR POWERED WORKSHED FOR DHOKRA ARTISANS INAUGURATED



A work shed and solar panel system were inaugurated for the Dhokra Cluster at Nuagaon, Dhenkanal, under Project Samridhi, supported by **TPCODL**. The facilities were formally handed over to the community in the presence of Mr. Pradeep Ghosal, Head CSR TPCODL; Mr. Sujit Sahu, DCE; Mr. Subal Kumar Jenamani, Deputy CEO, ORMAS. The solar panel will help artisans overcome power fluctuations and work seamlessly. The program also featured discussions on reviving the traditional Dhokra Craft and expanding its market opportunities.

SUBHALAXMI UDYOGINI PROJECT LAUNCHED WITH VEDANTA



The collaborative initiative Subhalaxmi Udyogini was launched with **Vedanta Group** - Jharsuguda to enhance women's livelihoods through cluster-based enterprise development across four blocks of Jharsuguda district. The Subhalaxmi Cooperative, which has engaged 5,000 SHG women for over a decade, is to be strengthened with improved corporate governance and institutional capacity for long-term socio-economic growth. An inception workshop was organized at the Subhalaxmi Cooperative office, attended by its BODs and CSR representatives from Vedanta.

AWARENESS PROGRAM ON CLIMATE-ADAPTIVE AGRICULTURE



As part of the project "Improving the Self-Reliance and Resilience of Rural Communities in Balangir District", supported by **Reliance Foundation**, an awareness program on climate-adaptive agricultural practices was organized at Bhoipali GP, Uparbahal by Mahashakti Foundation. The session focused on understanding and adopting AWD techniques, micronutrient application through drones, and discussions on climate change, its impacts, and future trends, encouraging farmers to adopt sustainable methods that enhance productivity, conserve water, and build resilience against climatic uncertainties.

PROJECT CHIRANTAN INTRODUCES AZOLLA CULTIVATION



Under Project Chirantan, supported by **HDFC Bank Parivartan**, communities in Bhuban and Kankadahada blocks of Dhenkanal district have initiated Azolla cultivation. Azolla serves as a natural and nutritious supplement for poultry, fish, cattle, goats, and pigs, reducing feed costs while enhancing growth and productivity. It enriches soil health, improves farm sustainability, and opens up opportunities for supplementary income for many rural households, especially women farmers, who are now adopting it as a low-cost, high-benefit livelihood option.

NABARD-SUPPORTED FPO PROMOTES SCIENTIFIC MAIZE CULTIVATION



Uteivalley FPCL, promoted under the CSS of GoI, supported by **NABARD**, has initiated a 170-acre maize cluster in M. Rampur by providing quality seeds to farmers. A special collaboration with IIMR has been established for 20 acres in Ambagaon and Jhaliaguba villages to promote scientific maize cultivation. CBDO officials reviewed crop progress and cluster management, while plans are being made to create market linkages with IPL Company and traders to ensure fair prices. Farmers are also receiving direct technical guidance from IIMR scientists on pest management to improve yield quality.

PROJECT LEAF COLOUR CHART LAUNCHED IN BALANGIR



The launch of Project Leaf Colour Chart in collaboration with **Precision Development (PxD)** was held at Jharbandhali village, Agalpur Block in Balangir in the presence of Mr Rohit Goel - Program Manager, PxP and Ms Shreyanshi Singh - Senior Program Associate, PxP, members of Chheliapat FPCL, and local stakeholders. Its objective is to distribute Leaf Colour Charts (Dhana Sara Suchaka) to farmers, enabling informed nitrogen application decisions for paddy crops. Through this initiative, 2,000 farmers in Agalpur Block will be supported during the Kharif and Rabi seasons to enhance crop productivity and promote sustainable farming practices.

REVIVAL OF ETIKOPPAKA CRAFT THROUGH ALAMKRITA



Mahashakti Foundation, in collaboration with **Vedanta - VGCB**, is conducting a training program for vulnerable women on Etikoppaka wooden lacquer toys, a craft unique to Etikoppaka village in Andhra Pradesh. The initiative is being carried out under Project Alamkrita (Art & Culture). Currently, 14 women are enrolled in the training, where they are learning various toy models and carving techniques. The program aims to enhance their skills, preserve this traditional art form, and create new income opportunities for women artisans.

MILLET CONSUMPTION AWARENESS RATHA PROGRAMME ORGANIZED



A 3-day Millet Consumption Awareness Ratha Programme under **Shree Anna Abhiyan** was organized in Rairakhol block, facilitated by Mahashakti Foundation and supported by DA & FE, Sambalpur. The campaign was flagged off by Mr Samalei Prasad Parida, ADAO, Rairakhol, in the presence of Mr Amit Patel (BAO), Mr Prayas Pradhan (BTM), VAWs, and AOs, who collectively emphasized the importance of millet cultivation and consumption. As part of the programme, a leaflet on millet benefits and recipes was distributed among community members to raise awareness and promote healthy dietary practices.



GRAM VIKAS TEAM'S EXPOSURE VISIT

The Gram Vikas team undertook an exposure visit to the Model Nursery established under the Integrated Village Development Programme at M. Rampur block. The team also visited the solar-powered agricultural unit, showcasing renewable energy integration in farming, and the check dam, developed to strengthen water conservation and irrigation potential. The visit highlighted how a convergence of sustainable nursery management, green energy solutions, and water resource development can drive climate resilience and empower rural communities.

NEW BATCH OF APPLIQUE CRAFT TRAINING LAUNCHED

A new batch of Applique Craft Skill Development Training was initiated at Srirampur, Khordha, under the Art & Craft Cluster Development Project supported by **YES FOUNDATION**, with the objective of strengthening the artisans' traditional skills and enhancing their livelihood opportunities. Alongside this, a Financial Literacy Training session was conducted, during which artisans were educated on key topics such as savings, budgeting, financial planning, insurance, digital payments, and awareness about cybercrime. To assess their existing knowledge and understanding, a pre-test survey was also carried out through a structured questionnaire.



PROJECT SHAKTI PROGRESS DISCUSSED AT HINDALCO OFFICE

Project Shakti staff participated in the monthly review meeting held at **Hindalco Industries Limited** FRP Campus (Aditya Birla Group), Hirakud, which focused on progress made against the planned KPIs and featured a detailed presentation by the DCOR team on baseline survey findings. The session was held in the presence of Mr. Jitesh Rath, Ms. Jayashree Rao, and Mr. Siba Mahapatra, Cluster Head, Hindalco. Representing Mahashakti Foundation, Managing Director Mr. Jugal Kishore Pattnayak also attended and shared valuable insights during the meeting.



DDM NABARD INAUGURATED AKALABYA FPC OUTLET

Mr. Hatakishore Behera, DDM NABARD Bargarh, visited Akalabya FPC, Padampur, promoted by Mahashakti Foundation under the Central Sector Scheme of the Government of India, supported by **NABARD**, accompanied by Ms. Rojaleen, Secretary of Mahashakti Foundation. During the visit, he inaugurated the FPC outlet, reviewed the products and financial records, interacted with the Board of Directors on sales performance and overall progress, and encouraged them to adopt innovative practices for strengthening market linkages and farmer income. He appreciated the collective efforts of the Board and members in ensuring transparency, quality, and accountability in operations. Mr. Behera also emphasized the need for business diversification and capacity building to make the FPO self-sustaining and profitable in the long run.



SPOTLIGHT INTERVIEW

1. Could you briefly introduce your organization VillaMart and its core areas of work?

VillaMart is an Odisha-based Agri-Tech Startup working at the intersection of agriculture, technology, and market linkage of farm products. Our mission is to empower farmers by providing them with a fair and reliable marketplace for their produce. We operate through three key models: (a) franchised phy-digital outlets (both mobile and static), (b) partnerships with quick-commerce platforms such as Instamart, Blinkit, and BigBasket, and (c) the haat model, where leftover produce is marketed locally. These models ensure minimal wastage, better price realization for farmers, and affordable, fresh produce for consumers.

2. How do you see initiatives like VillaMart contributing to rural development and livelihood opportunities?

Initiatives like VillaMart create a win-win ecosystem for all its stakeholders, such as FPOs, SHGs, Farmers, franchise partners and also consumers. On one hand, farmers gain assured market linkages, fair pricing, and reduced dependency on middlemen. On the other hand, rural youth and women are engaged as franchise partners, logistics operators, and support staff, creating sustainable livelihood opportunities at the village level. By bridging the rural-urban divide, VillaMart not only enhances income for farmers but also contributes to strengthening rural economies.

5. Looking ahead, what opportunities do you see for scaling such models in other geographies?

The challenges faced by farmers, such as lack of market access, price fluctuations, and post-harvest losses, are not unique to Odisha. They exist across India and even in many parts of the world. VillaMart's hybrid model, which combines physical presence with digital technology, is highly adaptable to diverse geographies. With the right partnerships and policy support, we see tremendous potential to replicate and scale this model nationally and even globally, thereby contributing to more inclusive and sustainable agri-value chains.

3. In your view, what role do partnerships play in strengthening community-based programs?

Partnerships are critical. No single organization can address the complexities of rural development alone. Collaborations bring complementary strengths, whether it's access to technology, financial resources, or grassroots networks. By partnering with corporates, NGOs, FPOs and government bodies, VillaMart has been able to scale its impact more effectively and ensure that community-driven solutions are sustainable in the long run.

4. From your perspective, what impact has the collaboration with MSF created on the ground?

The collaboration with MSF has helped us reach deeper into rural communities and engage with marginalized farmers who otherwise struggle to access formal markets. Together, we have been able to build awareness, strengthen farmer groups, and improve market readiness. This partnership has not only increased farmers' incomes but has also fostered greater confidence and resilience within the community.

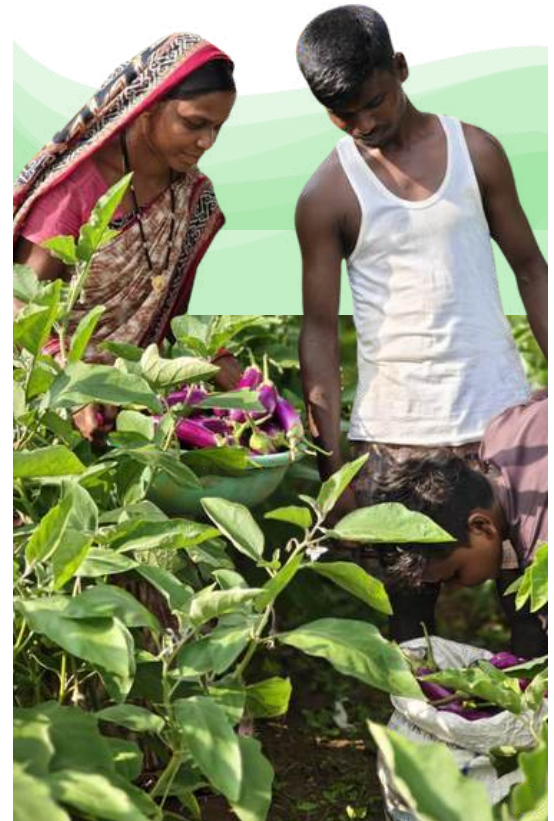


SOLAR IRRIGATION TRANSFORMS MAHESWAR'S FARMING JOURNEY

Maheswar Patra, a farmer from Podelkuna village in Madanpur Rampur Block, has emerged as a shining example of how small farmers can transform their livelihoods when given access to the right resources. In Madanpur Rampur, where only 12.4% of households have irrigation facilities, Maheswar too struggled with the same limitation. For many years, he was dependent solely on cotton cultivation as a monocrop on his 0.5 acre of land. With no reliable irrigation facilities, he could not attempt crop diversification or grow vegetables during the rabi season. His earnings from cotton remained modest at around ₹16,000, leaving little scope for growth.

The situation changed after Maheswar came under the scope of the Integrated Village Development Program (IVDP), supported by LTIMindtree, through which 12 micro-solar irrigation system has been provided, where 50 acres of land are being irrigated, benefiting 50 farmers and Maheswar was one of them. This became a turning point in his farming journey. With assured water availability, Maheswar expanded his farming activities and ventured into vegetable cultivation across 4 acres of land, growing brinjal, tomato, okra, and cauliflower. The impact was visible in a short time. In the recent harvest, he produced 2 quintals of brinjal and 1.2 quintals of tomato, along with other vegetables. Further, with convergence support, he received a solar-powered drip irrigation system that ensured efficient use of water and significantly boosted his crop productivity.

Reflecting on this transformation, Maheswar shared how his household economy has become more secure with diversified farming. His income rose to nearly ₹30,000 per season, almost double what he previously earned from cotton alone. With round-the-year cultivation now in practice, he feels confident about the stability and sustainability of his farm. His success is encouraging other farmers in the area to adopt similar practices for better income and resilience against uncertainties.
