RESPONSE TO FLOOD VICTIMS



Heavy rain triggered by back-to-back low pressure over the Bay of Bengal has caused flooding in different districts across the state.

The horror of flood amid the Covid-19 pandemic is acting like a curse to the people of Odisha. The low lying areas across the state remained underwater for a number of days. Due to the swelling of Mahanadi & Paika Rivers caused by excessive rains, several villages of Tirtol blocks of Jagatsinghpur districts are completely flooded. People are struggling for food and even drinking water.

RAGI CULTIVATION

Mahashakti Foundation with the esteem support of Odisha Millet Mission in collaboration with ATMA & WASSAN for the first time focussed on the production of Millets in 19 villages of Bargarh District in order to increase the household consumption of Millets because of its good nutritional value. Millet (Ragi) Cultivation by adopting PVT (Participatory Varietal Trail) is being done at Bijepur Block in Bargarh. 10 varieties of Mandia seedlings were planted in order to know the variety that suits the best in the soil of Bijepur and its production capacity.

CLUSTERWISE ANIMATORS' MEETING OF E-SHAKTI

Mahashakti Foundation under Project E-Shakti with the support of NABARD is working for the digitization of SHGs in Bargarh district. The main intention is to digitise all the data of the SHGs where the real status of each SHGs can be found under one dashboard.

A Cluster-wise Animators' Review and Planning Meeting was held in different Blocks of Bargarh so as to concentrate on concrete plans and for future courses of actions.





AWARENESS PROGRAM ON INSURANCE SCHEMES

Inorder to increase Awareness on insurance and making people understand the features, advantages and benefits of insurance products, Mahashakti Foundation with the esteem support of Grameen Foundation conducted a Mass Awareness Program under Project "Awareness Generation and Uptake of Insurance for Poverty Alleviation" at Getsarobarpada, Balangir. The Master Trainer trained on different government schemes such as PMJJBY, PMSBY, SSY and APY. Total 43 Participants attended the program and 39 got enrolled under various schemes.

FIGHT AGAINST COVID-19 WITH HABITAT FOR HUMANITY INDIA & ZERODHA

The Covid-19 Pandemic is having a Deep Impact on people's lives and livelihoods. As the economy is already collapsed, there's a lack of opportunities to earn because of the high to very high level of impact on businesses even after the Unlock. Corona has triggered a deep economic crisis along with an unprecedented human toll. The livelihoods of people is derailed and the rebound looks unfeasible in the near future. The earlier imposed lockdown has been taken off. But the miseries of Migrants continues. The worst part of life is when a person has to struggle to feed himself at least two times a day.

During this time of tragedy, the only thing which we can do is - Show some humanity to the people who are severely affected by the economic shutdown resulted due to the pandemic. Their condition is disturbing and distressing. They are battling a battle that has been very harsh and ruthless to them. With each passing day, they are pushed deep into the ocean of poverty. Saving their lives must be the first priority as a responsible citizen.

Mahashakti Foundation in association with Habitat for Humanity India and with the esteem support of ZERODHA, distributed 55 Family Essential Kits to Migrant Workers, Divyangs and other vulnerables in Madanpur GP & 70 kits in M Rampur GP, 136 Family Essential Kits at Mohangiri & Manikera villages, 65 Kits in Nunpur village and 354 Kits in Singhpur village of M Rampur.

FIGHT AGAINST COVID-19 WITH MILAAP

The country's lockdown began in late March and was subsequently extended several times. Stringent restrictions halted most economic activities and caused millions of people to lose their jobs and revenue streams. It has put India's poorer population face-to-face with an existential crisis. The sudden economic disruption triggered by the lockdown left the daily wage labourers, small shop owners, migrant workers, street vendors penniless. Many of them were daily wage earners. Now it has become a very strenuous activity for the people to revive their businesses and restart with their normal lives.

Mahashakti Foundation with the esteem support of Milaap, provided with a grant assistance of INR 2000/- to 27 deeply & adversely affected women of Tarbha & Sonepur districts at Tarbha NAC and 69 women from Balangir districts at RMC Market yard, Balangir so that they can manage their livelihood during this trying period.







FELICITATION DUE TO RELIEF WORK DURING COVID-19 BY MAHASHAKTI FOUNDATION

STORY FROM GROUND



Women Entrepreneur plays an important role in local economy and a large percentage of microenterprises in developing countries are undertaken by rural women. Rural women frequently have primary responsibility for agricultural production, in addition to domestic responsibilities, livestock caring and child care. In a developing country like India where economic status of women is very poor, especially in rural areas and opportunities of income is very less, in this scenario the SHG have paved the way for economic independence of rural area. Although the Covid-19 Pandemic in its initial months, forced everybody to stay inside houses, but after the unlock phase started, these SHG women came outside and kick-started their works and began to earn.

Mrs. Allahdini Bagarti, a residence of Dang village in Bargarh, which is a model village of ACC Cement. After the health condition of her husband deteriorated due to certain medical conditions, he had to resign from his work. It left Allahdini with no other alternatives, but to work, earn and take care of her ailing husband and school going children. She then along with some other women formed a Self Help Group named Maa Annapurna SHG last year and started saving money for a year so as to qualify for getting loan.

After a year, in the month of June, Mahashakti Foundation conducted a meeting in the village, and promised financial support through Pratingya Trust. After proper documentation, Allahdini was sanctioned with a loan amount of INR 10,000 with an interest of 1% per month. With the loan amount, she opened a grocery cum vegetable shop in her house and is doing a good business. At present, she's earning of about 6000-8000 per month.

Allahdini had to slog hard to start a business and be the breadwinner of her family. Her husband, who also stays at home all the time due to medical illness is her biggest support. Strong will can win you every odds, is evident from the story of Allahdini.
